Using archival footage, provides an overview of the history of car manufacturing in the U.S., citing 1953 as a time when three out of four cars in the world were made in America. Speaks with Chrysler president Robert Lutz about the management system developed by Alfred Sloan in the early 1900's which created divisions within a company, making change a slow process. Surveys a modern Toyota plant in Japan to compare their procedures and measures of efficiency with those of the U.S. Profiles Chrysler's current project to develop the new LH, using a team approach. Records the behaviors and events which make the festival an occasion of special interest to students of folklore (as well as a matter of general interest to others): the special language and clothes unique to the antique car culture; the tales of personal experiences and past reunions; the recounting of sacrifices made to buy and restore cars; and stories of adventures and travel in the classics. Scenes include storytelling at the "Presidential Suite" in the Auburn Hotel, a gathering of mechanics for some late-night repairs, a chicken barbecue and steak fry, and the Parade of the Classics around the courthouse square. Explains that the primary cause of most skids is a change in speed or direction that is too abrupt for road conditions. In sudden emergencies, "squeeze braking" and a proper balance between steering, braking, and acceleration are the most effective ways to maintain vehicle control and prevent wheel lockup. Emphasizes the need for investment in alternative forms of transportation and energy sources, both to salvage the environment and to gain U.S. independence over foreign control of energy resources.
