Explores the myths about air bags that persist despite their proven success in protecting people in frontal car crashes. Shows how air bags and safety belts complement each other for the best protection in car crashes through new crash test footage, interviews with survivors, a police superintendent's testimony, and on-the-road demonstrations. Discusses the various challenges, expenses, responsibilities, and alternative methods of transportation. Surveys the wide range of factors affecting handicapped busing. Includes a question and answer period and lists several books and films on the topic. (INHSLI)

FORGOTTEN COAL MINING FATALITIES IN INDIANA COUNTY, PA 1900-1930

Examines why there were so many small-scale accidents in coal mining during the early part of the century. Argues that competition among mine owners offered them a reason to pay workers by amount produced independently, forcing the workers, who made their own decisions on safety matters, to use unsafe methods to remove the coal. Suggests that the United Mine Workers union was more concerned with protecting mining unions in new states than with protecting worker safety. Points out that large-scale accidents, those which took five or more lives, decreased at the same time, due to legislation enforced by the federal Bureau of Mines. (DUDTKUP;c1994)

Focuses on Don, Eileen, and Simon, who work for a greeting card company where we are reminded of the kinds of accidents that occur in offices: slips, falls, collisions, lifting, and fire. Recommends general good housekeeping and points out that if common sense and safety precautions are used, the greeting "Get Well Soon" will not be needed. (LIVEACP;IFB;c1982)

Shows scenes of people engaged in active sports while teens who have been permanently disabled by spinal cord injuries discuss their attitudes, their accidents, and the adjustments they have had to make. Points out that all accidents are unexpected, unintentional, and unplanned but have lifetime consequences and can happen to anyone. Suggests that we do not need to place ourselves intentionally in harm's way and urges young people to consider the real risks and possible consequences of their actions. Communication; 2. Activities of Daily Living; 3. Home Safety.

HOW TO SAVE A CHOKING VICTIM: THE HEIMLICH MANEUVER

Employs a step-by-step approach to teach the use of the Heimlich maneuver to save a choking victim. Illustrates the application of the maneuver when the victim is standing, sitting, or lying down. Cautions against the use of excessive force when using the technique. Discusses precautionary measures useful in preventing choking. (AIMS;c1979)

HYPOTHERMIA: NATURE'S COLD KILLER

Examines the human response to cold, symptoms of hypothermia, and various emergency treatments. Highlights experiments conducted by Dr. Keith Cooper at Foot Hills Hospital in Calgary, Alberta, Canada, that demonstrate physiological responses to decreasing temperature. Explains how the body shunts blood from the outer to inner core (the heart, liver, lungs, and brain) in order to protect the most vital functions. Identifies the symptoms of hypothermia as loss of muscle control, irrational thoughts, and increased rate of breathing. Demonstrates different techniques for delaying a decrease in body temperature when immersed in water. Suggests various first aid treatments for individuals subjected to poor weather conditions on land. (SPECTRA;IFB;c1981)

Dramatizes an accident in the office of an English manufacturing plant. Observes the Safety Inspector announcing that he'll make an office inspection on Wednesday. Shows cartons stacked in the aisle, boxes blocking the fire extinguisher, and a broken bottle hastily dumped in the wastebasket. Follows as a new secretary delivers her report, trips over torn carpet, and falls head first into the wastebasket where the broken bottle has been thrown. (MILLBFL;IFB;c1981)
